

# International Day of Women Human Rights Defenders: Celebrating Courage in Times of Adversity

n November 29th, the world celebrates the International Day of Women Human Rights Defenders, a date that takes on even greater significance in the current context of political, democratic, and human rights crises in Mozambique. This year, the celebration occurs amidst a period marked by uncertainty surrounding the October 2024 elections and state repression of peaceful protests, which have resulted in at least 75 deaths, hundreds of injuries, and arbitrary detentions.

While the crisis affects everyone, its burden is

especially severe for women human rights defenders. These women face not only the challenges encountered by their male colleagues, such as intimidation, violence, and delegitimization, but also gender-specific threats, including sexual harassment, discrimination, and a disproportionate share of family responsibilities. As a result, women defenders often find themselves on the front lines of a dual struggle: against human rights violations and against the gender stereotypes and barriers that seek to silence them.

# **The Critical Role of Women Human Rights Defenders**

Women human rights defenders are the voices that rise above the silence imposed by repression. They provide legal, psychological, and social support to victims of violence, lead efforts to document abuses, and mobilize communities to demand justice. In Mozambique, these women play a vital role in building democracy and promoting

human rights, often at great personal cost.

As Michelle Bachelet, former UN High Commissioner for Human Rights, stated: "When women defend human rights, they challenge not only repression but also the gender norms that seek to keep them silent. They are the force behind the most transformative changes in our society."

## **A Challenging Reality**

Mozambique's current context vividly illustrates the challenges faced by women human rights defenders. In a country where state repression has intensified, women fighting for human rights encounter a range of additional threats, including:

Harassment and public defamation, often targeting their personal lives.

Criminalization of their work, labeling them as

"agitators" or "opponents."

Threats to their physical integrity and their families, used as tools of intimidation.

These threats do not deter them. On the contrary, they serve as a reminder of the resilience and strength of women defenders, who often take extraordinary risks to protect the rights of others.
